Wilhelm Johann Schlenk (1879–1943)

- Born in Munich.
- Studied in the Chemistry Department of the Academy of Science in Munich, led by Prof. Adolf von Baeyer.
- 1905: PhD (Prof. Oskar Piloty).
- 1906: after a short time in the chemical industry, research assistant in Munich. Habilitation passed in 1909.
- 1913: Associate professor at the University of Jena.
- 1917: with Johanna Holtz, report of the preparation of organosodium and organolithium compounds.
- 1918: nominated for the Nobel Prize for his work on stable radicals.
- 1921: Director of the Chemical Laboratory at the University of Berlin.
- 1929: Schlenk equilibrium.
- 1935: Removed from his chair in Berlin and moved to Tübingen (because of his rather open hostility to the Nazi regime). He was expelled from the *Deutsche Chemische Gesellschaft* in 1942.
