## Henry Gilman (1893–1986)

- Born in Boston, USA.
- 1918: PhD in Chemistry from Harvard University (Prof. E. P. Kohler). Visited Europe during his PhD; met Marie Curie and Victor Grignard in Paris.
- 1919: Assistant professor at Iowa State College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts (now Iowa State University).
  Full professor in 1923.
- Took part in the Manhattan project during world war II, studying the preparation of volatile uranium derivatives.
- 1947: because of glaucoma and detachment of retina, Gilman became blind in one eye and lost most of his vision in the other.
- 1975: Stopped active research at the age of 82.
- Co-authored 1020 papers! More than half of them were written after he had become blind.
